





Premium Sharing Rewards Premium Sharing Rewards

Unique program in which coffee farmers can acquire assets to improve their livelihoods

- Farmers earn points for a variety of activities, such as implementing best agricultural practices on their farms
- Roasters charge a premium when they sell this coffee to consumers, and those proceeds purchase assets for the producing organization
- The farmers in that organization can then use their points to select the items they need most from a catalog of assets

In our recently completed pilot in rural Rwanda, assets included mobile phones, pruning saws and shears, grow-it-yourself mushroom kits, and solar-powered lights. We assembled the roster of assets by listening to farmers about what they need.
